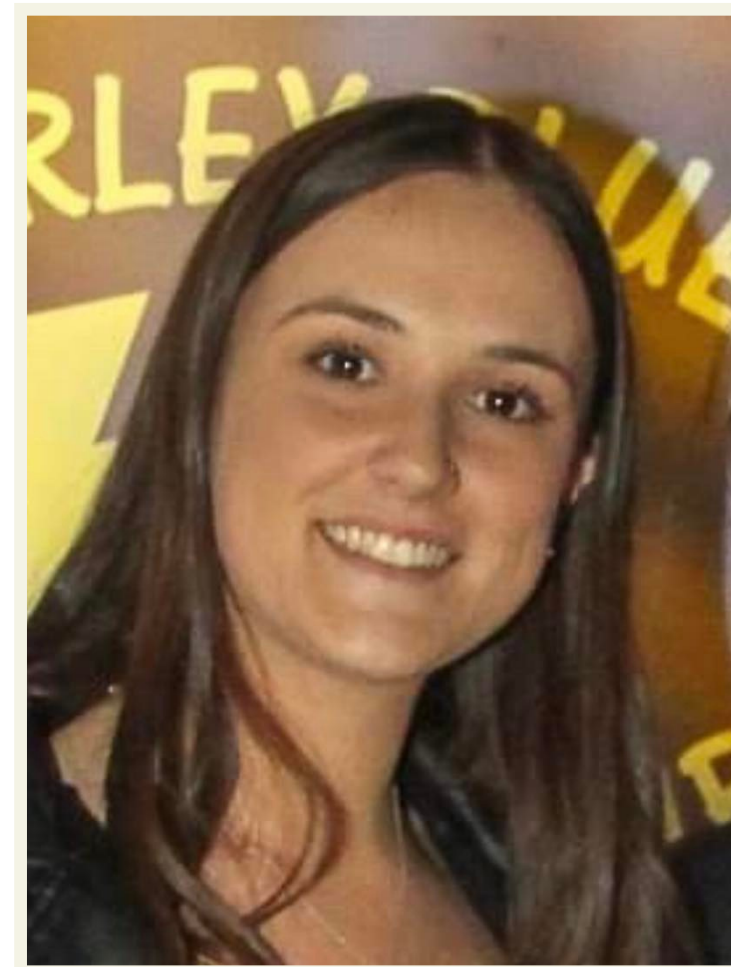


APRIL GLARE
