WHAT HAS SHE BEEN UP TO?

On completing Year 12 at Mt Waverley High School (as it was known then), Jo went to Monash University and graduated in 1984 with a Bachelor of Medicine and Surgery. She initially worked at the Alfred Hospital before moving to the UK in 1990 to finish her specialty medical training (FRACP) in respiratory medicine and allergic disease, working in Southampton and London. She returned to the Alfred Hospital and Monash University in 1994, graduating in 2000 with a Doctor of Medicine.
